wing thickness.) BATTERY DISCHARGER: by Bill Johnson This discharger can be used for most


airborne packs. Transmitters with their lower current drain do not need discharging. The circuit uses a fifty ohm relay, switch, bulb, and a plug to fit your battery pack.

Set the relay up to drop our at 1.4 volts.

To discharge half of the pack, or two cells plug in and manually push the relay in, this will cause the light to light and discharge the pack. When the boltage reaches 1.4 volts the relay will open cutting off the current drain.

Switch the switch position to do teh other half of the pack and repeat the above.
