
When you read this, it will already be August, and that means we are in the 4th quarter of our fiscal year. At the end of this quarter, we will be voting for new officers for our club. With that in mind, I would appreciate it very much if anyone that may have any receipts for events or club expenditures to please get them to me. This way you can be reimbursed, and I can close the books at the end of the fiscal year without any outstanding expenses. This will make the rollover to the new treasure easier for him or her.

Now with the business side taken care of, I can talk shop. The last week in July, Bill Oltmer asked me to check his CG on his Super Stinker via the weight method. Bill had mentioned that he felt it was balanced, but just wanted to check it with a different method. After the setup, measurements and calculations, it appeared to be tail heavy. We checked it with the finger method and with his Great Planes balancing tool and ended up with the same conclusion. The next question was what to do ??????? We looked at the battery pack, which weighed approximately $\frac{3}{4}$ of a pound. On the spreadsheet, we removed the battery pack from the airplane and notice that the balance was just a little forward of the CG. This is good for the first flights of a new plane. Looking over the airplane, we found that we were able to move the pack forward. Entering the weight and where the battery pack would be located, did not change the CG. After placing the pack in that location, we did the finger method and Great Planes tool and the balance looked good. The following day I watched Bill fly the Super Stinker for the first time. It did not exhibit any bad habits and the balance seemed to be good. I will say, Bill flew the plane very well. Congratulations and excellent flying your new Super Stinker, Bill.....

It just goes to show, when you finish a new airplane, always look at different ways to double check your CG balance. Remember..... TAKE OFFS ARE OPTIONAL, BUT LANDING ARE MANDATORY......

The only other complaint I had was trying to hand start that engine. Needless to say Monday afternoon I was down at GJ'S buying the Sullivan Dynatron Ultra High Torque Starter. The plane rolls really nicely, and with the help of some exponential the loops will be great also. 
