Updated AGS By-laws by Doug Breneman

Thanks to those members who gave me feedback on the proposed changes to the by-laws. Only articles 16 and 17 have been affected by these suggestions. Below you will see the amendments. These amendments along with the proposed by-laws printed in the June edition of The Connector will be voted on at the next meeting.

Article 16: RESIGNATION, TERMI-NATION, DISCIPLINARY ACTION, EXPULSION AND REINSTATE-MENT OF MEMBERSHIP

16.1 Any member in good standing may resign his/her membership by giving written notice to the AGS.

16.2 If any member ceases to have the qualification necessary for membership in the AMA, his/her

membership in the AGS shall thereby terminate, subject to reinstatement upon restoration of eligibility.

16.3 This section provides for enforcement of the Safety Rules that are related to flying activities. Any other unacceptable behavior by an individual member or members, as defined by the Board of Directors, become

the responsibility of the Board of Directors. Any individual may be expelled from membership from the AGS by

a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the Board of Directors if, in the Board of Directors' determination, such individual willfully commits any act or omission which is a violation of any of the terms of these Articles of Incorporation and By-laws, or the Rules of the AMA, or which is detrimental to the AGS, the AMA, or model aviation.

16.4 Any member who is expelled from membership may be reinstated to membership only by two-thirds (2/3) majority

vote of the membership.

16.5 Voting will be by secret ballot at a regular monthly meeting.

16.6 The Board of Directors shall have the discretionary authority to provide for and to impose disciplinary action for such acts or omissions, which do not justify expulsion from membership.

Article 17: GRIEVANCE PROCE-DURE (FLIGHT AND GROUND SAFETY RULES)

17.1 Purpose

The grievance procedure provides a mechanism to enforce existing safety rules by providing a progressive

disciplinary system when needed. Although most complaints can be resolved informally, if a complaint is serious or cannot be resolved informally, the matter should be referred to the Safety Committee for its consideration by means of a Grievance Form to be filled out and turned into the Safety Committee Chairman.

At least one witness is required to sign the Grievance Form.

17.2 Safety Committee

The Safety Committee shall use its judgment in carrying out action on the following:

17.2.1 A grievance form will be filled out and turned into the Safety Committee Chairman. At least one witness is required.

17.2.2 FIRST VIOLATION

- a. Viewpoints of both complainants and accused will be considered.
- b. Complainant's name will be disclosed.
- c. A verbal reprimand will be given to the accused by the Safety Committee, and this will be recorded in the Committee files.
- 17.2.3 SECOND VIOLATION
- a. Complainant's name will be disclosed.
- b. The accused has the right to a written rebuttal, to be reviewed by the Committee
- c. If the Committee so decides, the flying privileges of the accused will be suspended for thirty (30) days. Written notice of this shall be issued and a copy published in the AGS newsletter.

17.2.4 THIRD VIOLATION

- a. Committee will notify the accused in writing and the AGS members via the AGS newsletter that the AGS will vote on the expulsion of the accused at the next meeting.
- b. Said expulsion will last for a one-year minimum. (Longer if deemed necessary by the Board of Directors).c. The expelled member may reapply for membership after the expiration of the expulsion time period.
- 17.2.5 The three actions will not be enforced unless they are accumulated within a two-year period of time.

17.2.6 Any member receiving a Grievance, who directs any retaliation action against the person filing said Grievance, will be subject to immediate expulsion from the AGS. This is to include threats, intimidation, physical harm, intentional equipment damage, or any other action deemed to be retaliatory by the Board of Directors.

Weather permitting, Marc Trudeau will be giving flight demonstrations of his discus launch glider. For those who couldn't make the Aerobatic Contest on Saturday, he gave us a flight demonstration during a break in the action. After his flight demonstration, Marc was telling us about some of the heights and flight times top pilots can achieve using this unique method of launching gliders. Marc has recently competed in his first contest and will be sharing some of his thoughts on this. So plan on making the next program and learning more about these silent fliers.

Responsibilities:

- 1) Ensure that all mowing is completed between Thursday and Saturday noon.
- 2) Use the tractor/flail mower set at low height for runways.
- 3) Use tractor/flail mower set at high for parking area and around small pavilion.
- 4) Use the tractor/flail mower set at high for road to pavilion and around large pavilion.
- 5) Use hand mower for area near fences and around both pavilions.
- 6) Use personal weed whacker if possible around bottom of fence and pavilion posts.
- 7) Clean outhouse with water and detergent, sweep floor and replenish toilet paper.
- 8) Report any problems to Frank Gioffredo, Field Chairman, at 748-9858.

Visitors. We had one and it was Mike Kunzman who has since joined us.



The AGS does not have a phase of operation called: Member of the Month, Member of the Year, Outstanding Member, etc. If we did, however, any award, any accolade, any recognition that could be given should be given to Frank Gioffredo for the absolutely amazing work he did to make the 48th annual AGS Aerobatic Contest a success. From the first alert that we lost our Blue Swan Airport site, to policing the area late Sunday afternoon at the Sidney Airport site after this year's contest, Frank Gioffredo was there every step of the way.

I admire Frank for stepping up to fill Bob Noll's shoes when Bob found out that he had a conflict with the AGS Aerobatic Contest and a national commitment for the AMA World Aerobatic Team Selection. Bob had to be in South Carolina and so the assistant Contest Director, Frank, became the Contest Director in an instant.

What did Frank have to deal with? If all Frank had to do was find a new aerobatic site that would have been more than enough. That he had to do it in such a short span of time would have been too much to ask. But such was the case for our 48^{th} annual contest. So now the new site at Sidney was secure, well, not exactly. There needed to be a meeting of the village of Sidney to get approval. After what seemed like an extended delay, the village actually did approve our use of the airport for the contest. Hurdle one was over. Or was it? In our initial contact with the airport manager Bob Noll, Art Riegal, and I had discussed camping at the airport. It was agreed upon where we could camp. When the village gave the approval, however, they did not allow camping at the site, so alternate camping needed to be secured.

Frank did another scramble and found great camping facilities for our contestants. Now how could be communicate this? Go to our website, of course, and put it there. Were a few phone calls in order? Quite a few to be correct. These were mostly long distance calls that the AGS will never know about.

Now we have an aerobatic site and places to camp. As the song says, "We've only just begun..." All our old sources for ancillary items were in Sayre, but our site was now in Sidney. Where would the dinner come from? What about something as simple as finding tables? This list is too long to enumerate all the problems Frank had to face and resolve. Did Frank have help? For sure, but the buck always stopped at Frank's front door. Artie Claudino was terrific for resolving a wide assortment of logistical problems. Even with Artie, however, the buck was still stopping with Frank.

Oh! Did I mention the fact that our sanction from AMA was submitted far in advance by Bob Noll for this contest? The sanction, however, was for the Blue Swan airport. We all thought we were having our contest at Blue Swan. It all had to be changed at the last minute to the Sidney airport. This was more than a scramble to say the least. Between countless phone calls, faxes and emails we finally had the sanction and the appropriate insurance coverage for this even.

Let's fast forward to Friday as we were preparing to set up the aerobatic site for the weekend's contest. Who was at the AGS field picking up all the items that were stored in our garage since the last contest? Frank, of course. We all know that Frank is a big and powerful person. Every ounce of his strength was used in getting our equipment from our AGS airport to the Sidney airport.

Now the site is set and ready for the weekend's flying. Were all of Frank's problems now over? One would like to think so, but in another sense his problems were only just beginning. There was weather to contend with and the threat of weekend rains. Happily the rain held off for the weekend, but there were other problems. We were at an active airport. We had the support of the airport management and of the village. There was an instructor, however, who thought we shouldn't be there. There were student touch and goes all morning. This was a great frustration to the pilots who came from all over the northeast to fly. Most unfortunately Frank took the brunt of their complaints and even harassments. It was one final nail in the coffin that was trying to bury Frank. Finally Frank declared that we were on a one-hour lunch break and flying would resume flying after our second series of student touch and goes.

Happily for the contestants it finally boiled down to flying against the winds and ourselves for scores with the judges. The balance of the contest went smoothly, all thanks to Frank's indomitable spirit and determined attitude to succeed. Looking back at our 48th annual Aerobatic Contest we can say it was a success in spite of itself, but with great gratitude to Frank Gioffredo.

One closing thought that I know Frank would insist on. No one person puts on such a massive undertaking as an aerobatic contest. Frank had a lot of help from many, many outstanding club members. People like Bob Noll who did so much background work before he left for his national responsibilities; Terry Terrenoire who always does such a great job with our food; Art Riegal and Bob Jennings for their great job mowing the site, etc. There were so many great people in charge of so may support areas, but there was one man who finally was responsible for it all and every AGS hat needs to be taken off to Frank Gioffredo for his Herculean efforts to make our 48th annual aerobatic contest a success.
