Well, the year has passed. We have weathered some storms, both figurative and literal. The road to the field has had some major work done to it; but still needs some TLC. Maybe we can squeeze some funds into this area next year.

As the year ends, the by-laws require an "audit" of the financial books. On Monday evening all 4 elected officers gathered at Paul's house for that audit. We spent nearly 2 hours going over 10 pages of financial records for the past 11 months and found everything to be in good standing. Since there was some carryover last year of expenses and credits from the prior administration, it is difficult to determine just how we faired this year as a net. It appears that we saw a reduction in the net treasury of \$422. Since the cleaning of the ditches on the road cost

us \$400 that was not in the budget; we came as close to a break even as is possible.

For next year we are looking a 3 budget items that will increase our expenses by \$720. Our school taxes went up \$400. We anticipate a \$200 increase in County taxes due in January, and we are going to have to start paying \$25 a month for our new meeting place.

A new meeting place, you ask. Yes! It seems that the Legion management is not happy with our \$100 yearly donation, and wants us to pay \$50 per meeting. For 9 meetings that would be an increase of \$350. Thanks to Bob Balsie's wife, It looks like we have a new place in Endicott for \$25 per meeting. This only increases our cost by \$125

I know this is not a good way to start out the new year, but there is little we can do to alter any of these expenses. We did have one member, Ed Helinski, who found a spot for us in the Maine Endwell HS. But it would require a change of meeting dates, and the people I have spoken to are not in favor of doing that; but we can talk about it at the next meeting. Since this is the ANNUAL meeting, I am hoping for a better than usual turnout.

If you have also been members of the AGS for at least 10 years, you are eligible to be Senior Members and the big thing about that is the dues are only \$54 per year instead of the Regular \$66. I know guite a few members are at the field almost daily, but some of us still work way too long hours to make this possible. Secondly, both 5 gallon gas cans were empty so we had to mow the pavilion area with the hand mower running on fumes. I subsequently took both gas cans, refilled them and brought them back. This is a

small task guys. Refill them, submit the receipt to me and I will reimburse you, but please do not leave empty cans at the field for the next crew!

Jerry Roscoe showed a 13V @ 13A power supply which cost only \$25 and can be used to power 12V battery chargers.

Matt Struck displayed a Light Machine Corona 120 electic helicopter which uses NiCd battery packs. Cost was \$300 plus gyro and radio.

Joe Perrucci showed his Venus ARF to which he has made various modifications.

Dick Allen displayed his original design Hummingbird. With a .91 FX motor, it has unlimited vertical performance.




INDOOR FLYING:

Two ultra-light airplanes visit the AGS field

Dave Merithew and Steven Bard did some R/C flying Wednesday, September 17 and were joined by two visitors from Ithaca. The unusual part of the visit was that they arrived by ultra-light airplanes.

Dan and Andrew Thurnheer were taking advantage of a near perfect early fall morning to fly down from Ithaca to visit friends near Owego. When they could not land due to fog in the valley they decided to try to land at Tri-Cities but it also had a full measure of fog. Our AGS field however was above all the soup. They decided to try to get in to check it out and perhaps to wait for fog to clear out.

Dave and I figured out their intent after the planes circled a few times, then one lined up to come in. Dan landed on 33 then radioed Andrew that runway 6 was better suited because of its slight up hill pitch. Their planes had no trouble landing.

Turns out both fliers had R/C experience with Andrew presently active R/C flying in the Ithaca area. Andrew has in the past attended the giant scale event at Chenango Bridge. He seemed interested in pattern activity and may come down to check things out some time.

The ultra-light planes they flew were "Flight Star" two place planes with sixty horsepower four cycle apposed twin engines turning adjustable pitch three bladed props. The gentlemen serve as dealers for this company and extended an invitation to contact them if anyone has an interest: 607-273-3930

We talked planes, models and ultra-lights until time for them to take off. The gentlemen got into their planes, one all white the other blue under wing and tail, white on top, started engines and taxied to take off runway 15 towards Endicott. Recall this runway starts out up hill, levels out a little before the intersection, then goes down hill. I was interested to see where the planes left the ground. Each plane rotated in front of the flight control box and crossed the intersection perhaps five feet in the air climbing smoothly. Clearly the AGS field suits these planes just fine.
