## The Prez Sez Terry 3 Sez Terrenoire



Well, maybe we can finally put the roof debate to bed. During the April Board meeting all seven members discussed the pros and cons of all 3 options. Six of the seven favor the installation of a new standard shingle roof over the existing shingles. One of those 6 was willing to support a steel installation if the majority went for it. Here is a summary of the discussion.

#### Facts:

Rolled roofing:

Easy to apply

Costs: approximately \$270; Life expectancy: 10 to 15 years.

Shingles:

Labor intensive to install; Cost: approximately \$265 for 25 yr, \$365 for 30 yr

Life expectancy: 25 to 30 years.

Steel:

Easy to apply

Cost: approximately \$730 Life expectancy: 75+ years. Objections: Objections to the steel were cost, and a general unfamiliarity with the material. Objections to the rolled roof were cost relative to life expectancy, appearance, and additional cost in manpower and money for the removal of the old shingles, or the risk of reduced life if installed over the existing shingles. There were no objections to the shingle option. It is a medium everyone is familiar with, the cost is the same as the rolled roof material, and the life expectancy is well understood.

**Conclusion:** The Board is recommending that we replace the roof with new shingles.

Now, on to another difficult subject, new officers are needed in the next 5 months. At the Board meeting, Bob Balsie said that he would be willing to move into the position of Treasurer next year. Thank you, Bob. That leaves President, VP, Secretary, and Board Member at Large available for some enthusiastic individuals. In the past we have established a nominating committee to recruit for these positions. This method has been met with varying degrees of success. At this point, I am encouraging all Board members to recruit members to fill their positions. If you are interested in serving, either on a nominating committee, or as an officer next year, please contact any Board member.

#### Flight School



#### **AGS AEROBATIC PRIMER 2004**

June 5 should be a great day for the AGS if the weather cooperates. This is the date for our Annual Aerobatic Primer. This event is for all non competitive aerobatic pilots. Anyone who has ever competed in a sanctioned AMA aerobatic contest will not be permitted to fly in this event.

As I always say there is a particular challenge in flying maneuvers on demand. That maneuver could be as fundamental as straight flight, or a loop, or a roll. Doing it in a particular location at a requested time makes even the most fundamental maneuver more challenging.

If you want to get serious about improving your flying skills please join us at 10:00AM on Saturday, June 5, 2004

There will be flying and setup tips at 10:00. Lunch will be served at 12:00N and the contest will follow lunch.

The maneuvers to be flown are the SPORTSMAN (401) series as set forth in the AMA rule book. The maneuvers are: TAKEOFF, STRAIGHT FLIGHT OUT, <u>HALF REVERSE CUBAN EIGHT</u>, STRAIGHT FLIGHT BACK, <u>HALF CUBAN EIGHT</u>, TWO INSIDE LOOPS. TWO POINT ROLL, <u>STALL TURN</u>, COBRA WITHOUT ROLLS, <u>IMMELMANN TURN</u>, ONE HORIZONTAL ROLL, <u>SPLIT "S"</u>, DOUBLE IMMELMANN WITHOUT ROLLS. Now you set up for your final maneuver, obviously LANDING.

This year there will be three judged flights. The first flight will include all the above maneuvers but they will be flown one at a time, in the center. not in the AMA 401 scheduled sequence. The second flight will include all the above maneuvers as flown in the AMA 401 schedule with centered and <u>turn around</u> maneuvers. The third flight will consist of any eight (8) maneuvers you select out of the above list. You will have to select centered and <u>turn around</u> maneuvers. You may repeat one centered and one <u>turn around</u> maneuver.

Turn around maneuvers are underlined and in italics.

If you are confused by any of the maneuvers they will all be flown with a hand model and in the air, if you wish, before the contest starts. If you would like some extra practice time, please feel free to contact me any time.

# Field Mowing List 2004 YOU WILL NOTE THAT THREE PEOPLE ARE ASSIGNED TO EACH MOWING TEAM LEAD TEAM MEMBER MUST BE FAMILIAR WITH TRACTOR AND MOWER OPERATION.

#### Responsibilities:

- 1) Ensure that all mowing is completed between Thursday and Saturday noon.
- 2) Use the tractor/flail mower set at low height for runways.
- 3) Use tractor/flail mower set at high for parking area and around small pavilion.
- 4) Use the tractor/flail mower set at high for road to pavilion and around large pavilion.
- 5) Use hand mower for area near fences and around both pavilions.
- 6) Use personal weed whacker if possible around bottom of fence and pavilion posts.
- 7) Clean outhouse with water and detergent, sweep floor and replenish toilet paper.
- 8) Report any problems to the Field Chairman.
