#### DIFFERENT PROP FOR RACING

Hi Racers,

Terry, Jim and I had the opportunity to discuss Quickee 500 racing with a very knowledgeable pilot at the WRAM's show. This guy did an extensive amount of prop testing for NEPRO (New England Pylon Racing Organization). He convinced us that we would be better off if we run APC 9x6 props rather than the 9x7 we have been using.

The advantages of the 9x6 prop are:

- better acceleration off the starting line

- better acceleration exiting the turns

- better recovery to top speed if a pilot makes a boo boo by being jumpy or over rolling

- slightly lower top speed (5 to 10 MPH)

We were planning to mention this at the March meeting but, as you know, that meeting was canceled. So we will be using 9x6 APC props this season.
