Modern engines and radios can be used and the plane can be newly built as long as it is based on a pre-1970 design.


Events for the weekend will include a pattern contest for Class I (rudder only), Class II (rudder and elevator) and Class III (rudder, elevator and ailerons.) Of course throttle control can be used in all classes.

There will also be a Concours event that recognizes the best representation of a vintage plane, and a vintage scale event. The "Designer of the Year" is Hal deBolt and so many of his designs will be flying. Open flying will be available for those who do not want to compete in any of the events.

Flyers do not have to be a member of the VR/CS to enter so any AGS member who has an old design plane lying around should join the fun. Dust off that Falcon 56 or that deBolt Champ and have some fun.

Flying will start both days at 9 AM and there will be a banquet on Saturday evening at the Treadway Inn in Owego. The event usually end about 3 PM Sunday.

If you aren't able to fly, come and see what we used to fly in the 50's and 60's. There will probably be some planes controlled by rudder only and some interesting "galloping ghost" control systems.

There's a lot of good reasons for only counting the top 6 scores that weren't obvious to me before I started Q500. It allows racers to miss up to 4 races and still have a chance to win the season. Racers can start late in the season or, miss a few races due to business, vacation, illness or some accident to their racer and still be in the running for the season. I would have mentioned weather but so far we have really lucked out (Oops - perhaps I shouldn't have written that - too late).

In race 6 there weren't enough Busch racers to have their own Busch heats but for race 7 we were lucky enough to have 3 Busch racers. Jerry Riegal and I had a good time in Busch flying right down to the wire for a photo finish in two of the races. Jerry took a dive at the finish to overtake me on one race but was a propeller behind on the next. In the excitement of one of the races I think my lap counter forgot how to count to 10, the race videos are still under reviewed! I keep telling the lap counters the only requirement for a lap counter is to be able to count to 10. I guess the next race besides taking their word for it I'll have to test them.
