#### Condition Critical! PLEASE read this carefully.

In the 7 years I have been a member of the AGS we have seen a significant decline in membership. This is not just an AGS problem but a national one as well for many clubs. The AMA recognizes this issue and has been working on programs to try and grow interest in the hobby.

The Aeroguidance Society is now officially enrolled in the AMA's "Intro-Pilot Program".

In a nutshell the program allows **Non-AMA members** to get 60 days worth of full AMA insurance coverage provided they are flying at the club field ONLY under the direct supervision (on a buddy box) of the club's designated Intro-Pilot Program instructors. These designated instructors are Terry Terrenoire, Frank Gioffredo and Scott Wallace. The goal of the program is to capture the excitement of flying for folks with interest but that have yet to "take the plunge" and become AMA and club members. It is hoped that after the introductory time period these folks will be enthusiastic and motivated to get fully involved with the hobby and join the AMA and of course the AGS. The AGS has its own club trainer to use, however if the person has built their own model they may also use their own aircraft.

We have all at one time or another had a family member, friend or co-worker express an interest in our hobby. I challenge each and every member of the AGS to cultivate that persons interest for 2007 by pointing out that they can fly this year in this program without cost or obligation to themselves- just direct them to contact any of the three club designated instructors, we'll do the rest.

In closing let me point out that this in no way changes our standard club flight training program. If someone joins the club as an Associate Member they can still chose anyone they would like to work with for flight instruction. This program is only for those that have not joined the club or AMA and therefore requires the use of a club designated instructor. I would also like to take time to thank Scott Blazicek for agreeing to serve as Fight School Coordinator for this year. I'm hoping with a little effort from all of us we'll have plenty of new recruits by Summer. Thank you for reading.


#### **Membership**
