18th Annual Spirit of Selinsgrove Reunion

The AGS chapter of the Vintage RC Society will be the hosts for the 18th Annual Spirit of Selinsgrove Reunion the weekend of September 1st and 2nd at the AGS field. VR/CS Chapter III, The Golden Eagles, are continuing the tradition that was started 18 years ago to commemorate the Pioneers of RC who gathered at Selinsgrove, PA in the 60's to show off the latest in plane and radio designs.

The Vintage RC Society is an AMA Special Interest Group that was formed to preserve and promote the memory of Radio Control Aeromodeling activity and fly planes designed prior to 1970. Modern engines and radios can be used and the plane can be newly built as long as it is based on a pre-1970 design.

Events for the weekend will include a pattern contest for Class I (rudder only), Class II (rudder and elevator) and Class III (rudder, elevator and ailerons.) Of course throttle control can be used in all classes.

There will also be a Concours event that recognizes the best representation of a vintage plane, and a vintage scale event. The "Design of the Year" is the Class II Falcon 56 by Carl Goldberg. Open flying will be available for those who do not want to compete in any of the events.

Flyers do not have to be a member of the VR/CS to enter so any AGS member who has an old design plane lying around should join the fun. Dust off that Falcon 56 or that deBolt Champ and have some fun.

Flying will start both days at 9 AM and there will be a banquet on Saturday evening at the Treadway Inn in Owego. The event usually end about 3 PM Sunday.

If you aren't able to fly, come and see what we used to fly in the 50's and 60's. There will probably be some planes controlled by rudder only and some interesting "galloping ghost" control systems.

One of this club's biggest events is our hosting of our annual precision aerobatic contest each year. August 4 & 5 will be the club's 52nd running of this event. The site is the Blue Swan Airport property in Sayre, PA. Follow the yellow and red R/C signers after you exit Rt 17 at exit 60.

I have included a list of assignments and I hope each chairman has already contacted their teams in order to provide specific details and organize their shifts.

There is one important thing that I need to emphasize. The contest goes on in spite of bad weather so please be sure you are there to do your job even if the weather doesn't look flyable. Our contestants come from great distances and we must be ready for them. Flying starts at 9 AM Saturday and continues until about 6 PM. On Sunday we start at 9 AM and finish up around 3 PM. We have a reputation for starting our opening ceremonies on time and so if you are working the early shifts, please be there at 8:30 AM each day.

Many club members and contestants will be camping for the weekend at the airport. This is very convenient and a lot of fun, so you may want to consider this if you have a tent, camper or motor home. Port-A-Johns will be available but there will be no hookups.

This year we will again have a chicken dinner at the airport on Saturday evening. Tickets will be available at the contest. Terry and his kitchen staff will be handling this rather than hiring a caterer in order to maximize our profits.

Don't forget that club members can compete in all classes so why not try your hand at some aerobatics competition. The entry-level class is Sportsman and an average pilot with a trainer can do the maneuvers.

One more thing. If you are working on Sunday when the contest ends, please help with the teardown and clean-up. We must leave the site better than we found it.

I'm looking forward to another great contest and a club event that will gather most members to help. This is a great time to get to know your fellow club members, have some fun and watch some excellent aerobatics flying.

They showed that precision aerobatics can be flown using a wide variety of planes – an aerobatics plane, a small electric plane, and a sport plane.
