I'm sure by now most of you have seen the work around the outhouse and new stone in the pavilion a big thanks to Wayne Kunsman for getting it done. The field looks to be in pretty good shape. about becoming an officer next year. Now for my safety part. As most of you know I had a small incident with a new Tiny-X a small indoor-outdoor plane of Derek's. I was setting the final controls, removed the transmitter from the case turned it on and verified the plane and that all controls were in their appropriate places (throttle down) set the transmitter on the table, reached under the plane to plug in the battery the speed controller toned but sounded odd suddenly the prop roared to life, I grabbed the wing, about half way along the left panel as tight as I could with out crushing the panel and looked to the transmitter to see if it was out of place, the throttle was about one-third up, I heard the prop hit me but was getting the throttle down, the motor immediately responded and shut down. I looked to see a large pool of blood on the table and then to a large slash on my right wrist... Off to the hospital. Seven stitches later the wound is closed. My only thought was I must have bumped the throttle arm of the transmitter when I reached under the plane to plug in the battery. I consider myself to be very safety aware when working on and flying my aircraft and a little embarrassed to admit I had an accident. But lesson learned. First no props mounted before all other controls have been set, second place transmitter far enough away so you cannot inadvertently bump your controls, and third no matter what size your aircraft is, secure it so it won't move if you do not have a secure hold on it.
