# The V.P. Soap Box

At one of the Vintage RC events this past year, VRCS historian Beppe Fascione gave me a CD with all the back issues of the VRCS newsletter. An issue from early 2000 brought back a lot of memories. Going back to the SAM Champs back in the fall of 1999, Tom McCoy had mentioned to my dad (Hale) about the upcoming VRCS deBolt Reunion in Florida. My dad had been building and flying only SAM models for many years but had a long running friendship with Hal deBolt, going back a very long time, and he was excited to attend and see some old modeling buddies from the past. What few people knew was that at the time my dad had been diagnosed with terminal cancer and didn't have much time left. Despite that, my dad didn't want to go as a spectator; he needed to build a deBolt design for the event!

In a very short time frame he scratch built a Live Wire Sr. from plans he had saved for many years. The model was beautifully finished with silk & dope in deBolt's original orange and black colors. Power was a Veco .19, and he used his favorite radio, a Kraft signature series.

This was the last model my dad ever built, and as he was building it I learned that the Live Wire Sr. was also his first RC model that he built as a teenager back in the mid 1950's. So, some nice symmetry - this design was both the first and last RC model he built, with I'm sure close to a hundred other models built in between. The model was completed just days before he needed to leave for Florida but we were able to get a few test flights in and within minutes my dad was doing all the old Class 1 maneuvers pretty well, even though I'm sure it had been over 30 years since he had flown rudder-only.

In the Vintage Flier report on the Spring Hill fly-in there's a few photos of my dad along with Hal deBolt. My dad was aware he didn't have much time, but he wanted to see and fly with his old friend Hal and a few others one last time at the Spring Hill event.

I realize this doesn't have a whole lot to do with the AGS in 2013-14....or does it? RC modeling is many things to many people, but the one constant is that it forges lifelong friendships. As a New Year begins, that's as good a message as any I think of.

P.S., I have built several deBolt designs in the past and enjoyed them greatly. I now have my own Live Wire Sr. under construction and plan to have it completed for 2014 VRCS events. The model in the picture is not my dad's but gives you an idea of the model I've written about.
