New Member Profile

I am retired from IBM with over 36 years of service.

My modeling interests began at the age of 12 by building 1/2A U-control airplanes. After these first U-controls, I flew free flight airplanes and gliders. Later, I became interested in radio control. I built several single channel rudder only airplanes. These planes were built from kits or plans. My first radio was a kit-built tube radio system. As I gained experience, I discovered that single channel transistor radios proved to be much more reliable.

My first multi-channel system was an F&M 5 channel proportional system. I flew this system in several airplanes including a Sr Falcon and VK Cherokee. Over the years I assembled many single channel and multi-channel radios from kits. I credit these modeling activities for my career in electronics.

I find building airplanes from either kits or plans the most rewarding aspect of the hobby.

My interest in aviation was influenced by my home town, Lock Haven, Pa. This was the home of Piper aircraft for nearly 50 years.

In 1968, I earned my private pilot's license. In 1971 I added a glider rating and in 2001 an instrument rating to my license. Over the years, I have owned 2 gliders and currently own a Piper Cherokee 180 that is based at Tri-Cities airport in Endicott. My wife, Brenda and I enjoy weekend trips to fly-in breakfasts and local flying events.

My radio control modeling interests include airplanes, both electric and gas, and gliders.

AGS General Meeting Minutes

Aero Guidance Society Meeting # 796

February 3^{rd,} 2014

President Allabaugh called the meeting to order at 6:46 PM.

Minutes of last meeting: Accepted as published in The Connector.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Rick gave a summary during his budget presentation since Todd Kopl was not able to attend.

Announcements:

Rick reported that no one has volunteered to run the Winter Fly in February. After general discussion, it was decided not to hold a Winter Fly this year.

<u>Guests</u>: Mark Hunt, Matt Hunt, Neil Hunt and Mike Harris were introduced.

Discussion Items:

Jim Quinn expressed his concern about members having to personally subsidize club events.

Rick asked Bob Noll to clarify the board's position regarding financing of club events due to a recent e-mail circulated to members that contained misinformation. Bob stated the board's position as follows: Each event director should try to run their events on a "break even" basis. However, if expenses are not covered by those attending, the event directors will be reimbursed.

Frank Gioffredo repeated his statement made at an earlier meeting that he did not expect to be reimbursed for the New Year's Day Fun Fly. (Sec.- The treasurer did send a check to Frank for his small out-of-pocket expense.)

Jim Quinn agreed to run the Spring Fling in March.

Old Business:

Rick reported that the club sent flowers to Frank Gioffredo's father's funeral.

Rick passed around a sheet for meeting program suggestions.

Rick gave a general overview of the 2013-2014 budget which showed a deficit. It assumed a membership of 42 members.

Brent Bryson said that the club should only depend on sustainable income to meet our expenses and not depend on such things as land sale or tree harvesting.

A special general membership meeting to discuss the budget will be scheduled later in February with a target date of February 24.

Website – Rick stated that the current AGS web site at agsny.org will continue to be the official website of the club and will be redesigned primarily for members. The development web site has been terminated.

Mike Harris explained the new AGS Facebook site which is designed primarily to attract new members. Mike, as prime administrator, also explained how to use the Facebook site and mentioned additional club administrators.

New Business:

AMA Model Aviation Day for 2014 is August 16.

Bob Noll distributed AGS business cards that he made up in order to help with recruitment of new members.

Flight School Update

The traditional flying season is coming soon, and with it is the start of the AGS Flight School. Whether your immediate goal is earning your wings with your first solo, or gaining advanced flying skills the AGS Flight School is the best and fastest avenue to success. We are fortunate to have extremely qualified pilots, in terms of experience and skill, who have volunteered their time to be instructors, and staff members who will help you be successful in setting up, adjusting, and flying your aircraft. We also have a couple of club owned trainer aircraft that will be available free of charge, in the event that you don't have a suitable aircraft, or if your own aircraft is down for "maintenance".

The plan is to have a couple times every week that are set aside for flight training where students will be able to show up without needing to arrange in advance with an instructor. We also plan to have the AGS training aircraft available at the field during the training sessions in the event someone doesn't bring a plane, or their plane has a problem at the field. This will also enable students to attend training in the event that they get out of work right before the training session, or decide at the last minute that they want to attend a session. Of course we would like all students to make it to all sessions if possible for the greatest rate of advancement.

Each student will have their own training plan and training record so that they can track their progress, and have a good idea of what they will be learning next.

There will be more information, and a sign up sheet at the next meeting. Also, please call or send an email to me if you plan on being a student, or would like to be an instructor or helper. Keep in mind that you can be a student and an instructor or helper.
