The Prez Sez

As we near the end of 2014, from my family to your, we hope you all had a safe, blessed holiday season. By the time you receive this newsletter, the annual New Year's Day fun fly would have occurred. On to the next activity, the winter fly.

Just a reminder that our next general meeting will be Monday, December 5th. I would strongly recommend that you plan to attend as we will be proposing a change to the by-laws with respect to dues structure. We will also plan to review the proposed budget with the club and its impact on the membership. As you all know, we've been talking about a dues increase for the past year and a half and now would be the time to have a serious discussion on how to operate our club.

OPEN POSITIONS: There are still three (3) critical positions that we need to fill: Activities Chair, Program Chair, and Newsletter Editor. We'll be discussing these open positions at the next meeting.

I can't believe how addicted I am to indoor flying. I definitely don't have the flying skills of a few of the people that attend weekly, however I learn new things each week as a smack my crack yak into the floor. I'm currently in the process of adding carbon fiber veil over the nose to give it more strength as I have pounded it pretty good. Two lessons I've learned: Due to the amount of throw you need, it benefitted me greatly to add a lot (45%+) expo into the elevator and aileron control surfaces to prevent over-correction and loss of control;

(2) When flying outdoors and you get into trouble, you tend to cut power. Indoors when you get into trouble, you add power to get out of trouble. If you cut power, you smack into the floor, hence the carbon fiber veil... If you want to check out indoor flying, come to the Binghamton West Middle School, Tuesday nights, from 7 pm to 9 pm. The Aero Guidance Society Board of Directors is recommending the following changes to the By-Laws. These changes are required to change the method of determining dues, fees and assessments from the current fixed amounts in the by-laws to rates that will be determined by an annual AGS budget. The board will also have the responsibility to establish the budget to be presented to the membership.

The following format will be used to denote affected by-law articles;

Recommended deletions from the AGS by-laws are denoted by strike through text.

Recommended additions to the by-laws are noted in bold text.

Article VI- OFFICERS

Section G. The Secretary shall: (Deletions)

-8. Have discretionary spending of up to \$50.00 for any single purchase without requiring membership approval.

Section H. The Treasurer shall: (Deletions)

6. Have discretionary spending of up to \$50.00 for any single purchase without requiring membership approval.

Be a member of the Finance Committee.

Article VII- BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section K (Addition)

K The board of Directors shall be responsible to establish an annual budget to determine membership dues and fees for the year. This budget shall be presented to the members 2 months prior to the annual general membership meeting.

Section D (Change)

D Regular Member dues shall be determined by the annual budget. seventy-two dollars (\$72) per dues year.

Section E (Change)

E Senior Member dues shall be determined by the annual budget. –sixty dollars (\$60) per dues year. –

Section F (Change)

F Student Member dues shall be determined by the annual budget. eighteen dollars (\$18) per dues year.

Section G (Change)

G Family Member dues shall be determined by the annual budget. one dollar (\$1) per dues year.


