I was saddened to learn of George Brook's passing; George's contribution to the growth of RC in this area was almost immeasurable. More than just the owner of the local hobby shop, George was just one of the good people you encounter in life that makes a positive difference.

When I was just a kid back in the 1960's my dad used to take me to George's basement operation run from his home. There we could examine some of the neat kits, engines, and radios I would see in the magazines. All of my meager allowance back then was seemingly spent on Comet or Guillows kits.

As George's business grew, the shop moved often - to Washington Ave in Endicott, then over by UE High School, and eventually to Vestal. By the early 1980's I was stationed in Texas and was flying FF and CL and while fun it was mainly as that's all I could afford.

Every time I came home to visit always included a trip to GJs and finally around 1985 I had saved enough to buy a Goldberg Jr Falcon kit, Cox .049 and Futaba **2** channel radio. George saw what I had on the counter and said something like that combo would fly OK but was far from ideal, to which I explained I couldn't afford a 4 channel radio and bigger model. He pulled a Sig Kadet Jr kit from the shelf, and then a K&B 19 and Futaba 4 channel radio from behind the counter and magically it all rang up about the same price. George said the K&B 19 wasn't popular anymore and Futaba had come out with a new line of radios and this was one of the prior models...true or not I knew he made me a great deal, and I've been active in RC ever since.

The small town hobby shop where one could learn and interact with fellow modelers is I guess a thing of the past now but I'm grateful to have grown up in a time when people like George and his lovely wife Phoebe ran not just a business but provided a service that supported modelers and local clubs alike. The growth and success of the AGS through the 1960's - 2000 was helped in no small part by the contributions of George Brooks and his hobby shop.

Jeff Hatton gave a demonstration of his FPV Vapor. The aircraft has a small camera on board and the pilot can

wear FPV goggles. This is one RC airplane you need to sit in a chair while flying. Anyone that is subject to motion sickness or vertigo, beware.

Due to members commenting about full scale aircraft operation in the vicinity of the AGS field, Ray Phillips gave a presentation on actions being investigated with Tri Cities Airport management and informed the members about full scale flight paths, airspace and instrument approach procedures that are conducted near our field. Members should know that all manned aircraft have the right of way over unmanned aircraft. There has been no full scale near miss or accident reports for the last 40 years at our filed. One of the key concerns is the fact the full scale pilot have no knowledge of our field and operations.

Bob Noll displayed the 2005 AMA President Award that was present to the AGS in recognition of 50 years of dedication to model aircraft. Bob keeps this plague at his house for safe keeping. He also showed an AGS club history book that was published by the members and read a poem that was written by a previous member's wife.

On sad closing note, Bob Noll reported George Brooks passed away on Aug 31, 2015 in Andalusia, AL. George was 89 years old and was living with his grandson, Mike Finley. A sympathy card has been sent to Mike from the club.

November's Club Program – by Bob Noll and Scott Wallace

Did you know that on October 8, 2015 the Smithsonian in Washington DC accepted for display an exact replica of one of the earliest successful RC models? Yes, a 1952 Hal deBolt Live Wire Trainer (replica built by Beppe Fascione and featured a ground based radio transmitter) will soon be on display at the Smithsonian Air and Space Museum. This is a marvelous tribute to one of RC's founding fathers, Hal deBolt.

We'll have our own replicas of several of deBolt's most influential models on display as well as period radio equipment and engines to set the tone.

For the club old timers this will be a fun evening of nostalgia but for our newer members this will be very insightful program to learn about the effort and dedication needed 60 years ago to become an RC flier.

Update on Government Regulations from the AMA - submitted by Scott Wallace

I'm sure many of you saw or read about last Monday's press conference with the Dept. of Transportation and FAA discussing among other things the issue of government regulation/registration of "drones" which has cause a lot of concern among AMA members.

The following is a quote (used with permission) from AMA's Dave Mathewson on the subject of government

regulations and the AMA's position:

"There's a lot of misinformation floating around as a result of Monday's press conference. AMA certainly doesn't, and will not, support registration for traditional model aircraft. In fact, it's highly unlikely that DOT is considering that either. But there may be a threshold where we believe registration for some sUAS is appropriate. While that threshold is still being defined, it may be tied to the technological capabilities of the platform. AMA has been invited to participate on the task force and it's in our member's best interest that we do that for at least two reasons. One we want to be positioned to offer good suggestions on the issue and, maybe more importantly, we need to have a voice on that panel to protect the interests of our members."
