AMA to host AMA Expo East February 24-26, 2017 (formerly known as the WRAMS show)

The Academy of Model Aeronautics (AMA) in cooperation with the Westchester Radio Aero Modelers (WRAM) announced it will continue the long-standing tradition of hosting an annual East Coast hobby trade show, which will be held February 24–26, 2017, at the Meadowlands Exposition Center in Secaucus, New Jersey.

For 48 years, the AMA chartered WRAM Club produced and managed the 'WRAM Show'. It has been one of the longest-running shows of its kind in the model aviation industry. "Since we are not holding a show in 2017, we are pleased that AMA has stepped in to continue with a show for model aviation enthusiasts from Maine to Virginia," club officers stated.

The new show, AMA Expo East, will be modeled after the successful AMA Expo West, held in Ontario, California each year by the AMA. AMA Executive Director Dave Mathewson said, "The Westchester Aero

Radio Modelers' Annual WRAM Show has been a staple in the modeling world for nearly 50 years. AMA is pleased to be able to carry on the WRAM tradition that benefits model aviation enthusiasts from throughout the Northeast."

Next year's show will include guest speakers, new activities, and other special programs. AMA Ambassador and NASA space shuttle pilot and Commander Robert "Hoot" Gibson will be a one of the guest speakers. David and Sarah O'Neal, hosts of the popular podcast, That Drone Show, founders of International Drone Day, and director and producer of the new documentary The Drone Invasion, will also be attending as guest speakers. The Drone Invasion will be shown during their presentation.

Hello pilots,

So here it is.... Another month passed and I find myself pondering where did the time fly again? We are almost done with 2016, the New Year on our doorstep and Xmas day having gone by but hopefully each and every one of you were able to experience the child in you with something related to RC being under the tree and not some coal.

My passion for warbirds is still as strong as ever and my fleet continues to grow with variety. I must have been a good boy in my sweeties mind, enough so that there was a twin under the tree for me to play with this summer. Now I know I am getting older when the twin that got me aroused was an F7F Tigercat versus my thoughts of younger days.....haaaa.

So I remember writing in one of my past articles (can't remember month and too lazy to look it up) about the revolution in this hobby of the proliferation of foam ARF's becoming the leading facet of our modeling venue. Since that article there has been some interesting twists regarding the competition amongst a couple key manufacturing players. FMS used to be the big player for prop driven warbirds and Freewing the leader in EDF. In the last 10 months however a subsidiary line of Freewing called FlightLine RC has taken the street by storm and is the new big dog out there for prop driven craft. They have taken the refined fit/finish/hardware found on their jets and carried it over to prop airframes.

They have also established a credo to focus on a more diversified line up by doing unique and seldom or never before modeled airframes at better quality and pricing. In the past 6 months they have released two twins in the 1600mm(63 inch) wingspan of a couple iconic warbirds at the same value as an FMS 1400mm single motor, that being the a P-38 Lightning and just in time for under the tree a F7F-3 Tigercat. All 9 of the models released this vear since the company's inception has been 1/10 scale which allows for a rather decent presence both on the ground and air while also affording relative ease of transportation. This all was accomplished in concert by an alliance developed with a veteran owned web retailer known as Motion RC who has in the short 4 years since opening their doors become the number one customer service RC electric plane retailer bar none. Some of our pilots that have been to the AGS airport when I have been there with the P-38 and saw what it is all about (appearance/performance) were to say the least impressed. When I wrote a year or so ago about foam ARF's going the wrong way on price and I was going back to balsa, well this all has been a game changer for me whereas the balsa build media is no longer a viable aspect nor interest to me anymore do to issues for reparability, scale fidelity, comparable cost and time investment to be airborne. The technology that we as a society have embraced to either take away from or add to the free time in our lives is in full bloom within the modeling community and foamies are here to stay and maybe even replace the balsa predecessor. You owe it to yourself to see what all the buzz is about.

So we've got another 4 months of doldrums called winter time to get past but hopefully we can have all of those months for the club meetings filled with Show-N-Tells. I plan to have a couple contributions for it and I hope many others do to. In the short term though we've got the Jan club meeting and the Day After New Year's Day Fun Fly to look forward to so I'll see ya all in the New Year with a boyish grin on my face.

Almost inevitably my building spree of the past 18 months has slowed. I took a few weeks away from carving balsa to assemble some new Twisted Hobbies foamies for indoor flying and one larger one for outdoors.

Nevertheless, progress has been made on the Astro Hog to where it's 95% framed up. Unfortunately even 100% framed up is only **50% done** as there's still radio equipment and engine mounting to finalize and then finishing with fabric and dope. I best hope for an early spring with all the models that will need paint...I'm a bit envious of the guys with heated shops/spray booths!



With JR's impending demise from the RC hobby industry I stocked up with 2 new transmitters and quite a few receivers and servos...I'm set for a very long time now.

One of my new transmitters is the "classic old looking transmitter" or COLT for short. This is a limited production/hand-built transmitter and one of the last new items produced in JR's Japanese factory. It's essentially a modern 2.4 GHz radio housed in a 1970's Heathkit style aluminum case:



I've ported all my VRCS models over to this transmitter and can't wait to try it when the field opens. Over the years I've seen crash after crash at VRCS meets where folks insist on using their 40+ year old antique radios. For me it's more about re-creating and flying the great old airplane designs and not being such a purist that the radio must also be "vintage"...but to each his own.
