Now that the nice weather has arrived, and flying season is in full swing I thought it would be good to talk about safety. I have been around long enough to understand many of the rules in place today are for our protection. Nothing can ruin a great day at the flying field more than a preventable accident. And let's face it, we cannot prevent all accidents, but we can significantly reduce the risk. For example, years ago the AGS did not have the landscape timbers lining the runways, aircraft restraint tables did not exist, and the chain link fence was minimal. A good day at the field begins back in the workshop before you ever leave the house. Is the aircraft fit for flight? Are batteries charged? Never hurts to have a flying buddy take a second look, especially on a new aircraft.

Someone took the time to post the latest field rules at the field and I read them yesterday (can be done in 5 min). I would encourage you to do the same and I pulled a few key excerpts:

- 10. Aircraft in the pit area shall be restrained as follows:
- a. Aircraft powered by glow engines shall be restrained when the starting battery is attached.
- b. Aircraft powered by electric motors shall be restrained when the batteries are connected. Note: Electric aircraft must have a visible means (able to see without touching) of showing the batteries are disconnected when not physically restrained.
- c. Aircraft powered by gasoline engines shall be restrained when the ignition is energized.

Note: I am not the AGS Safety Chairperson

Harold has experience with The Carbon Cub since he has one that his children fly. It is great to see Mike's excitement after flying the Cub successfully. Mike is already learning how to handle and respect a moderate wind.
